



Creative Volunteer Efforts

With on-site volunteering limited, our supporters found other ways to engage. Groups contributed job training videos and information sheets to support economic empowerment. Other volunteers made activity kits for kids, hosted donation drives and so much more. **RESULT? Survivors felt your support and that support mattered.**

Greater Community Understanding of Domestic Violence

You invited us to speak to your organizations, houses of worship and groups of every kind. First, we presented virtually. Now we're offering in-person presentations, too. **RESULT? 3,810 people were reached with educational presentations creating a better understanding of domestic violence and where to turn for help.**

Notable Calls to Hubbard House's 24/7 Domestic Violence Hotline and Textline

You talked to your friends about Hubbard House. You passed along printed materials and shared our social media posts. You helped us reach people in your circle who were suffering silently. **RESULT? 3,245 calls were answered by Hotline advocates, and the callers found help and hope.**




And, About Your Generous Financial Giving ...

Technology Creating Better Tomorrows

With the help of a significant donation of laptops, Hubbard House expanded its advocacy program for survivors. Survivors now have access to case management and counseling by phone, online or in person.

A donor helped Hubbard House add Wi-Fi so survivors could continue to work, other survivors could apply for jobs and students could attend classes virtually.

Finding Safe Homes and Making Memories

A grantor awarded \$559,470 to Hubbard House's HOPE Rapid Rehousing Program. The funds will ensure more survivors and children secure safe housing.

Donors and partners provided holiday gifts to 37 families through the Adopt-A-Family program, and every survivor parent in the shelter shopped for free in Hubbard House's Toy Store, a wonderland filled with gifts donated by the community.

Awareness of Domestic Violence and Donations Support Survivor Services

With donor and sponsor help, Hubbard House moved the 2020 Barbara Ann Campbell Memorial Breakfast online. News4Jax also shared the program on Facebook. Overall, Hubbard House reached thousands of people, many for the first time, and supporters donated nearly \$90,000 for survivor services.

A local radio group produced a Hubbard House public service announcement (PSA) and placed it in rotation at no cost to Hubbard House. The PSA aired 577 times in the first month, reaching every corner of our community. It remains on the air, creating awareness even now.
