**29th annual Barbara Ann Campbell Memorial Breakfast
brings community together to light the path to
safety from domestic violence**

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., (10/11/23) — Civic leaders, prominent businesses, community champions, and supporters joined together at Hubbard House's 29th annual Barbara Ann Campbell Memorial Breakfast, presented by Bank of America. A memorial table at the Breakfast honored the 11 victims of intimate partner violence in Jacksonville last year. The table also featured a seat for Barbara Ann Campbell, in whose honor the event is held each year. Barbara Ann Campbell was killed by her husband, after leaving him. Her brother-in-law, the late Jacksonville Mayor Jake Godbold, was a passionate advocate for survivors, and Barbara Ann Campbell's family continues to support Hubbard House's mission.
