**30th annual Barbara Ann Campbell Memorial Breakfast unites
Northeast Florida in support of survivors of domestic violence**

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (Oct. 16, 2024) – Honoring 30 years of bringing the community together to commit to the vision of “Every Relationship Violence-Free,” today Hubbard House hosted the 30th annual Barbara Ann Campbell Memorial Breakfast, presented by VyStar Credit Union.

The event serves not only to unite hundreds of businesses, elected leaders, and community members, but to raise funds for Hubbard House’s life-saving, life-changing shelter and services. You can learn more about those services and share your support through [Hubbard House’s website](#).

“Because of our community’s support, Hubbard House walks alongside survivors every step of their journey to safety, and every moment they need us after that. To all survivors- until you are safe, Hubbard House is here for you,” says Hubbard House CEO Dr. Gail Patin.

The message “Until You Are Safe” is the center of Hubbard House’s Domestic Violence Awareness Month social media campaign. Marking the 30th year of hosting this event, Hubbard House set a memorial table to share the stories of the 215 people killed by abusers in Jacksonville over the last 30 years. This tribute is designed to honor these victims, while demonstrating how dangerous domestic violence is.

Alongside that memorial table, Hubbard House demonstrated the strength of survivors by sharing an exhibit to represent the more than 151,000 survivors and children helped by Hubbard House, in that same 30 years.

“Yes, the reality is that domestic violence is dangerous and scary. But safety is possible,” Patin says.

The memorial table also featured a seat for the event's namesake, Barbara Ann Campbell. Barbara Ann was killed by her abusive husband, as she was leaving him. Her family asked Hubbard House to share her story each year to help raise awareness, and her brother-in-law, late-Jacksonville Mayor Jake Godbold, was a passionate advocate for Hubbard House and this mission.
